ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR UNDERGRADUATE APPLICANTS

As a top-tier research-intensive university in Canada and the largest university in the province of Saskatchewan, our school is the only English-speaking university in Canada with such a broad combination of human, animal and plant studies on one campus. Here, students from more than 100 countries work together with professors and researchers as they contribute to our world in more than 100 disciplines.

General Requirements For All Programs

For admission to the University of Saskatchewan, you must have completed at least five suitable Brunei/Cambridge GCE O-Level subjects with grades of C or better and at least two Brunei/Cambridge GCE A-Level subjects with grades of D or better. The five GCE O-Level subjects must, in all cases, include Mathematics and a first-language literature/composition course.

Early Admission

You may apply for admission in the year you will be sitting for A-Level final examinations if you submit at least five suitable GCSE O-Level results and predicted A-Level results.

AS-Level Admission

Alternatively, if you do not intend to sit for any A-Level exams, you may be considered for admission if you have completed four acceptable Advanced Subsidiary Level subjects. Generally, two AS-Level subjects are considered in place of one GCE A-Level subject. Please contact the admissions office for more information.

Transfer Credit

You may be eligible to receive transfer credit towards a degree for A-Level subjects completed with a grade of at least C. To qualify, you must provide a course syllabus to the admissions office for review.

General Requirements for Applicants with National Diploma or Higher National Certificate or Diploma

Applicants with a completed National Diploma or Higher National Certificate may be considered for admission to a degree program related to their National Diploma field of study. Admission will be based on a review of all education completed after the Junior Secondary Assessment.

Applicants with a completed Higher National Diploma may be considered for admission with possible transfer credit toward their degree program. Applicants must provide a detailed syllabus of their Diploma studies.

Applicants with Post-Secondary Education

Applicants who have successfully completed coursework at any recognized university or college may be considered for admission on the basis of this course work instead of on the basis of their secondary results if they have 18 credit units or more of transferable credit.
