

Indian Curriculum Requirements

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL PROGRAMS

For admission to the University of Saskatchewan, you must complete a minimum of five acceptable Standard XII subjects including one subject of first-language Literature and Composition and one subject of Mathematics. Business education subjects (i.e. accounting) are not acceptable for admission. You must present certified true copies of your Secondary School Certificate (Standard X) and mark sheets and your Higher Secondary School Certificate (Standard XII) and mark sheets. If admitted, you will be required to present your original documents to the International Admissions Office upon arrival.

COLLEGE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the general requirements, you must present required subjects and have achieved a competitive average for your college of choice.

APPLICANTS WITH POST-SECONDARY STUDY

When you apply for admission we will review all education history for admission and transfer credit. The University of Saskatchewan considers courses from accredited institutions around the world for transfer credit. Generally, credit is awarded on a course-by-course basis for courses equivalent to those taught at the University of Saskatchewan. Your year of study and program requirements are determined by each college.
