### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR UNDERGRADUATE APPLICANTS

As a top-tier research-intensive university in Canada and the largest university in the province of Saskatchewan, our school is the only English-speaking university in Canada with such a broad combination of human, animal and plant studies on one campus. Here, students from more than 100 countries work together with professors and researchers as they contribute to our world in more than 100 disciplines.

#### General Requirements For All Programs

For admission to the University of Saskatchewan, you must have a High School Diploma as well as an additional two years of study at a post-secondary institute in the Philippines.

#### Early Admission

You may apply for admission before you complete your second year of post-secondary study if you submit a current transcript and a list of courses you are currently taking.

#### General Requirements for Applicants with National Diploma or Higher National Certificate or Diploma

Applicants with a completed National Diploma or Higher National Certificate may be considered for admission to a degree program related to their National Diploma field of study. Admission will be based on a review of all education completed after the Junior Secondary Assessment.

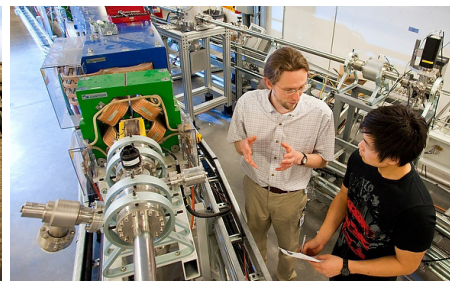
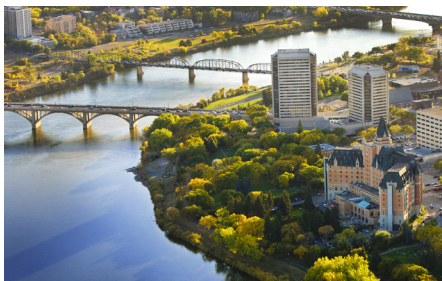
Applicants with a completed Higher National Diploma may be considered for admission with possible transfer credit toward their degree program. Applicants must provide a detailed syllabus of their Diploma studies.

#### Applicants with Post-Secondary Education

Applicants who have successfully completed course work at any recognized university or college may be considered for admission on the basis of this course work instead of on the basis of their secondary results if they have 18 credit units or more of transferable credit.

#### Transfer Credit

You may be eligible to receive transfer credit towards a degree for courses taken at Philippine post-secondary institutes after the second year. To qualify, you must provide a course syllabus to the admissions office for review. (OVER)



## College-Specific Requirements

In addition to the general requirement, you must present required subjects and have achieved a competitive average for your college of choice.

A 5-subject admission average<sup>1</sup> is calculated for each applicant based on the following criteria:

- First-language literature/composition
- Mathematics

Plus a combination of:

- Maximum 2 humanities or social science subjects
- Maximum 2 natural science subjects
- Maximum 1 fine arts subject
