# Entering students can now stack their awards

The University of Saskatchewan has changed its awards policy, which is reflected in its *Awards for Entering Students 2012-2013* publication. To receive a copy of this publication, e-mail [admissions@usask.ca](mailto:admissions@usask.ca).



Entering students to the U of S can now receive two types of awards: Guaranteed Entrance Scholarships, which are automatically based on a student's Grade 11 and 12 marks, and Competitive Entrance Awards, which students apply for and compete for among their peers.

The U of S recognizes that students work hard to achieve academic success in high school, and we want to recognize those achievements. Now, instead of one or the

other, students can receive both a Competitive Entrance Award and a guaranteed, automatic entrance scholarship of up to \$3,000.

A student's best awards average could earn them:

■ 95% or higher	\$3,000
■ 93% to 94.9%	\$2,000
■ 90% to 92.9%	\$1,000
■ 85% to 89.9%	\$500



## WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR A COMPETITIVE ENTRANCE AWARD?

An individual can apply for a Competitive Entrance Award if:

- They are a Grade 12 graduate coming directly to the U of S, or
- They have already completed high school and have less than 18 transferrable credit units.

In order to be considered for a Competitive Entrance Award, the individual must submit the following to the U of S by

### February 15:

- Application for Competitive Entrance Awards
- Application for Admission
- \$90 application fee

The following must be submitted by **March 15:**

- An up-to-date transcript including Semester One final grades and/or January mid-term marks for non-semestered subjects
- Supporting documentation, as outlined in each Competitive Entrance Award listing

The Competitive Entrance Awards average considers a high school student's five best subjects, as completed by the end of Semester One of Grade 12, according to specific criteria.

Students can apply for Competitive Entrance Awards at [explore.usask.ca/moneymatters/awards/](http://explore.usask.ca/moneymatters/awards/). If a student is selected to receive more than one Competitive Entrance Award, they will be asked to choose which award they wish to accept.
